TIP OF THE MONTH

The U.S. is facing a similar issues with grease, oil, and...baby wipes. Yes, those convenient wipes labeled "flushable" are coursing through the sewage with little breakdown, wreaking havoc on our sewage system.

What can you do to help? Try using baby wipes sparingly, and when possible, dispose of them in the trash. When cooking, try to wipe out greasy pots and pans with a paper towel before washing. For larger amounts of grease and oil, use an empty coffee can or some other sealable container to pour the oil into and then throw away.
